

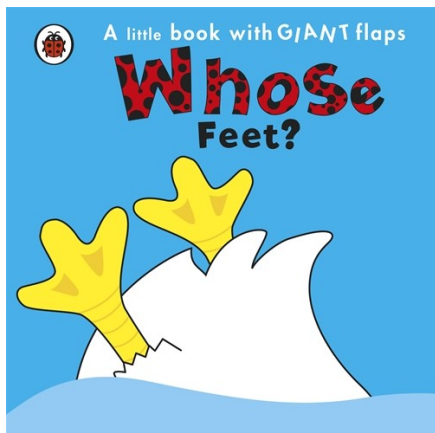

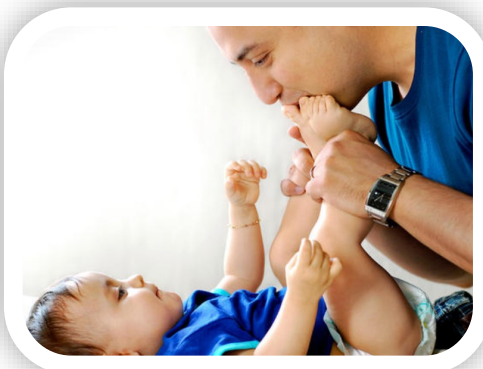
Who's that hiding on every page?
