New homes for current tenants

Our development of nine, one bedroom properties on Forth Drive in Craigshill will be completed in June or July of this year. Should you as a current tenant wish to be considered for one of these one bedroom flats, please contact our Housing Support Team on 01506 439291 or come into the office.

We operate a tenant led transfer policy which means that all of our new build properties will be allocated to current tenants in the first instance. To be considered your current tenancy needs to meet our re-let standards, and a property inspection would be required. Please do not hesitate to contact us with enquiries that you may have about this re-housing opportunity.



Is your current home meeting your needs?




Almond Housing Association is keen to ensure that all of our tenants are properly housed. If you feel that your current accommodation is not meeting your needs, we can offer assistance and advice to complete Housing Application Forms and ensure that your assessment is correct.

For example, perhaps...

- You have children as permanent members of your household who are under 12 years of age and live in a flat without direct access to a garden
- You have health difficulties that your current home is making worse i.e. internal stairs and you have mobility problems
- You are being subject to violence or harassment in your current home

We have seeded cornflowers and many other wild flowers in three areas in Craigshill and Ladywell. Between July and September they will be in full bloom. We have added some more colour to our green areas in Ladywell and Craigshill this summer by planting lupins, marigolds, poppies, cornflowers and many other types of wild flowers.

The flowers have been sown near The Courts and between Victoria Street and Inglewood Street in Craigshill, and in the Linnet Brae and Fulmar Brae areas in Ladywell.

A total area of 2,585m² will be in full bloom in July, making summer extra colourful.

Broken **Appointments**

For many years now we have offered an appointment service for repairs with about half of all reported repairs being attended to by appointment, and we are looking at ways of improving this part of our service. However, even though a specific appointment has been made for the work to be carried out, for one in twelve appointments the tenant is not at home.

> Of the 5002 job appointments made last year, 416 of them were wasted calls costing over £6,000 in total.

Wasted time on a call also means that someone else is being delayed from getting their repair completed.

Please remember to keep the appointment, and if you have any doubts you can always check with us. As a word of warning, those who abuse the

appointment system in this way run the risk of being

charged for the missed call - don't let it be you.
